Job Announcement: Community Media Organizer

BACKGROUND: KVRU is a low power station in one of the most diverse communities in the country. Since October 2017, KVRU has operated as a full service community station with a three-studio station located in the heart of Southeast Seattle. KVRU broadcasts arts & culture, information, and music 24/7 and live streams at: kvru.org. KVRU is licensed to SouthEast Effective Development (SEED), and is a program of SEEDArts.

POSITION: The Community Media Organizer will facilitate community created programs for KVRU by working with programmers, reporters, and producers. This is a temporary, part-time position funded by a grant, although our goal is to make this a permanent position. The Coordinator will work from February – December 2021. Compensation is \$20/hr for 20 hours/week. The Community Media Organizer will report to the Station Manager and work closely with the Program Manager.

Key responsibilities include:

- Oversee the KVRU media lab and equipment library;
- Facilitate virtual drop-in hours for one-on-one technical support for programmers;
- Coordinate multicultural producers and community reporters to provide weekly radio content;
- Help create and coordinate a sustainable on-air news program;
- Coordinate KVRU trainings, workshops and orientations.

QUALIFICATIONS: The candidate should have experience working with diverse communities, and excellent written and verbal skills. The candidate will be offering technical support to volunteers, so experience with audio recording and production is required. Ideally, the candidate will also have a background in journalism and/or experience with news program production.
